Step 4 COVID-19 Risk Assessment Checklist July 2020



As hockey moves into Step 4 of England Hockey's Roadmap in Returning to Play, it is essential that hockey providers assess the risks associated with hockey activity in line with England Hockey and wider Government guidance related to Covid-19.

England Hockey strongly recommend that all delivery organisers complete a Covid-19 specific risk assessment prior to the recommencement of hockey activity. This template should be used as a guide and completed in conjunction with a full risk assessment at the delivery venue in order to safely open these facilities and deliver hockey activity.

All Hockey organisers should appoint a 'Covid-19 officer' who is responsible for completion of this risk assessment and ensuring that all participants are compliant with all measures taken to ensure safety during hockey activity. It is strongly recommended that the delivery organiser completes a full risk assessment relevant to the venue and reviews this on a weekly basis.

Ensure all participants have signed an England Hockey Participant Agreement prior to playing hockey	An email was sent to all members on 22 nd August 2020, which included the link to the EH Participation Agreement. The Covid19 officer will share the list of members who have completed the form with the membership secretary on the 1 st September 2020 – 4 days before hockey resumes. Members who are not on the list will be contacted separately to remind them that this needs to be completed before they are allowed to play. Hard copies of the guidance and form will be made available at training for any new members who arrive who would not have received this information.	Medium
Ensure all participants are aware of all COVID-19 policies and processes in advance of activity	An email was sent to members on 22 nd August 2020 including Covid19 guidance specific to our club and venue. Each session will start with an initial briefing to remind members of the content and expectations.	Low
Ensuring appropriate provisions in place to maintain social distancing guidance and that participants are made aware of the policy in place around usage. This should include pitch lay out, timings, how people enter and exit the pitch, any process/cleaning before/after pitch bookings etc	The access to the pitch from the main car park is very wide and will allow for appropriate social distancing for people walking in the same or opposite direction. Members have been reminded in the guidance not to stand near the entrance/exit to allow people space to enter/leave. Members have been advised to spread out	Low

	along the length of the pitch when they arrive and to place their belongings an appropriate distance from others. As we do not own the pitch, the sports centre has been contacted re: signage and cleaning. There is a 15 minute changeover time between training sessions to allow players from the first session to leave the pitch before others arrive. The training equipment will be separated into two sets and only handled by the coach leading that session.	
Handwashing facilities (including soap and water) are available. Alternatively (or additionally) provide sufficient hand sanitiser. Regular hand washing should be encouraged. Consider how to manage non-compliance with actions taken to manage the risks of Covid-19	Club members have been made aware via the email sent on 22 nd August 2020 that non-compliance with the guidelines could lead to disciplinary action being taken by England Hockey. Members not complying with the guidelines will be spoken to by the Covid19 officer in the first instance and reminded of the guidelines and the agreement they have signed. Continued non-compliance may result in that member being asked not to attend training and matches in order to maintain safety for all.	Medium

the toilets in the sports centre. The sports centre have their own guidelines around indoor spaces, which we are waiting to receive. No changing facilities available and no refreshments will be offered.

Game/Training guidance

Ensure equipment is cleaned and disinfected before and after use. This should include preparation of the pitch for training/matches which may include moving goals, netting, corner flags etc.

Training equipment will be separated into two distinct sets and only handled by the coach for that session. The training equipment will only be used once per week so will be left untouched for more than 72 hours. The sports centre have been contacted regarding cleaning equipment for surfaces that may be touched on the pitch i.e. the goals.

Minimise the sharing of kit / equipment (including facemasks, goal keeping equipment etc.)

Members who use face masks regularly have been advised to purchase their own and the club will reimburse them. Each goal keeper has their own kit, which is not shared.

If providing face masks for defensive penalty corners, ensure masks are cleaned thoroughly before and after use and labelled to avoid sharing during games As above – players to use their own face masks.

Ensure appropriate First Aid provisions are accessible (see https://www.sja.org.uk/get-advice/first-aid-advice/covid-19-advice-for-first-aiders/)	Each team has a first aid kit, which is replenished at the start of the season. Face masks and gloves will be added due to Covid19. These will need to be worn if first aid is being administered by a second party. Hand sanitiser not included in the first aid kit as this poses a fire risk if kept within captain's vehicles. Members have been asked to bring their own hand sanitiser.	Low
Consider whether personal protective equipment (PPE) is required to safely run hockey activity and who may require PPE (e.g. those providing first aid, physios etc.)	See above	Low
Ensure social distancing is maintained for substitutes, team staff, officials, spectators and during breaks in play.	We have asked for no spectators initially while we manage players getting back into hockey safely. Players will be reminded in the briefing before the session about maintaining social distancing during breaks in play and when waiting on the side lines.	Low
Follow guidance from officials regarding free hits, penalty strokes, penalty corners, restarts etc.	Members aware that free hits and penalty corners need to be taken promptly to reduce the time players are in close proximity in the	Low

Identify any further risks specific to your environment:	We are awaiting full guidance from the school/sports centre, which will complement the guidance that has already been produced by England Hockey and the club.
